KIDNAP VICTIMS OFTEN FOUND SLAIN Many Children Have Been Killed by Their Abductors or Have Never Been Seen Again. CHARLIE ROSS LOST IN 1874 Grace Budd, Who Went to "Party" in 1928, Has Never Returned—Franks Tortured by His Captors.

Hundreds of persons, mostly children, have been the victims of kidnappers-murderers in this country and elsewhere in the last few years. In many cases they have been spirited away, never to be heard from again, like Charlie Ross, who was kidnapped in 1874. Raymond von Malusk, abducted in 1923, and Grace Budd, who trustfully went to a "birthday party" on June 3, 1928.

Two days after the kidnapping, a workman found the body of the Franks boy under a culvert in the wild and uninhabited section near the southern limits of Chicago. In the ensuing man-hunt more than a score of persons were arrested, but the real culprits were not suspected until the horn-rimmed glasses found on the dead boy, who never wore glasses, were traced to Leopold.

On Sept. 4, 1928, Mary Daly, 6 years old, was playing with other children when an automobile pulled up and she was snatched up and driven away. The parents received a note demanding \$4,000 ransom. The boy was fixed upon Harrison Noel, 19, son of a New York attorney and former insane asylum inmate.

Directions were received and the father, carrying the money, found not the kidnapper or his intermediary, but the horribly mangled body of his child. It was the result of revolting cases of murder in the annals of American crime, and the hunt was on. William Edward Hickman, a former employee of Parker bank, discharged for dishonesty, was suspected. He had disappeared, but was traced to Seattle, Wash., and finally captured at Elcho, Ore., on Dec. 22.

On an afternoon in December, 1931, Marian McLean was playing near her parents' home at Cincinnati when a stranger offered her candy. She accepted and was not seen again until her body was found in a cellar. Fukuoka, a Japanese youth, a keen admirer of Hickman, Leopold and Loeb, kidnapped Gill Jamieson, 10, son of a Honolulu banker in September, 1928, after demanding a ransom of \$4,000. Fukuoka strangled the child.

Another fatal kidnapping in recent years, though the motive was not extortion, was that of Giacomo Matteotti Socialist Deputy, who was murdered by Fascists near Rome on June 10, 1924.

The case of Charles Brewster Ross has been one of the most celebrated of kidnapping examples. The child, who was then 4 years and 2 months old—was the son of Christian K. Ross, merchant of Germantown, Pa. On July 1, 1874, the little boy was approached by two men who took him away, promising candy and firecrackers. He was neither seen nor heard from, but his abductors from time to time informed the parents that he was safe and that he would be restored for a ransom of \$20,000. The child was never seen again, but a fortune to find his child.
