

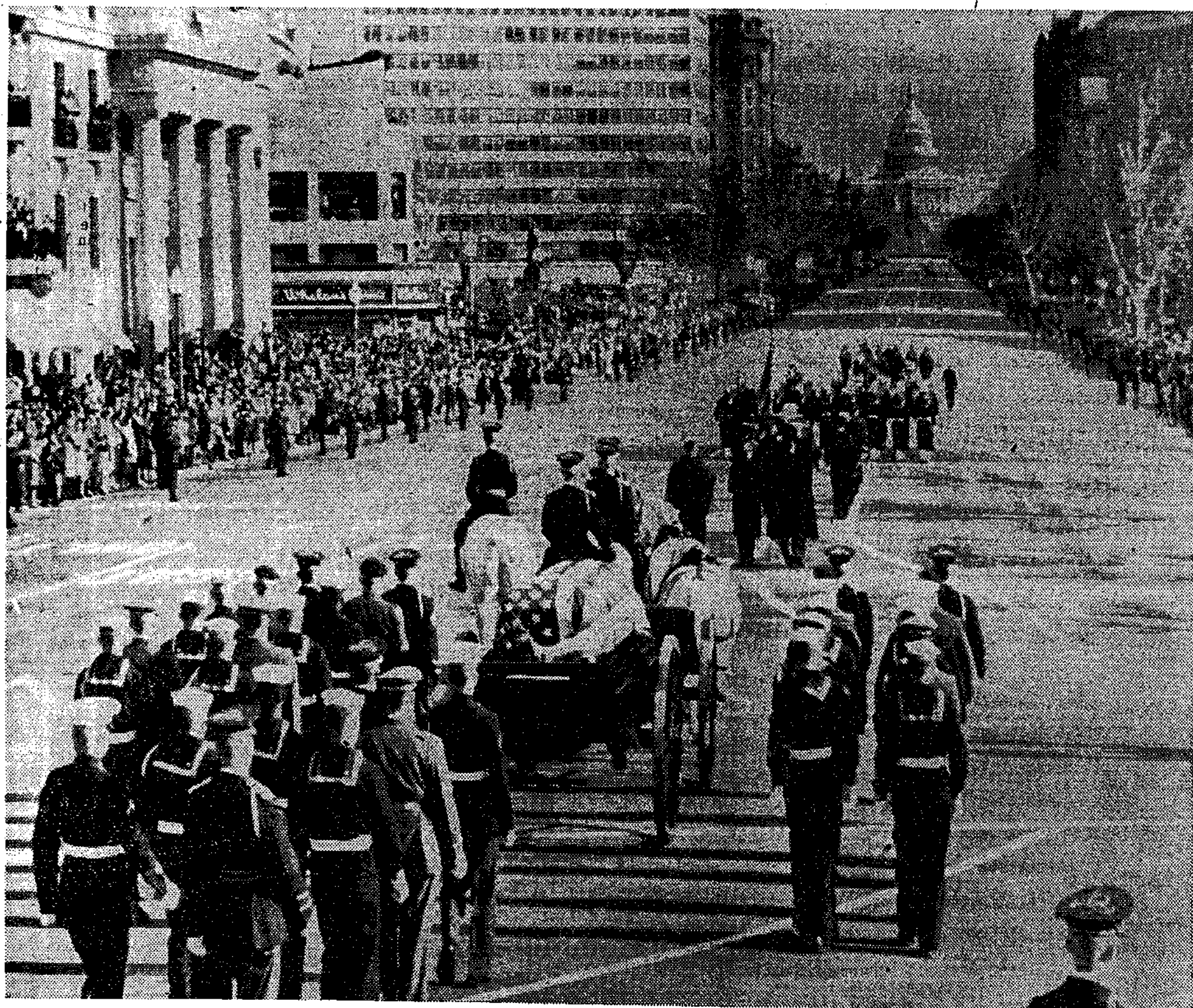
A Widow's Courage Catches at the Heart of a Nation as Kennedy Lies in State



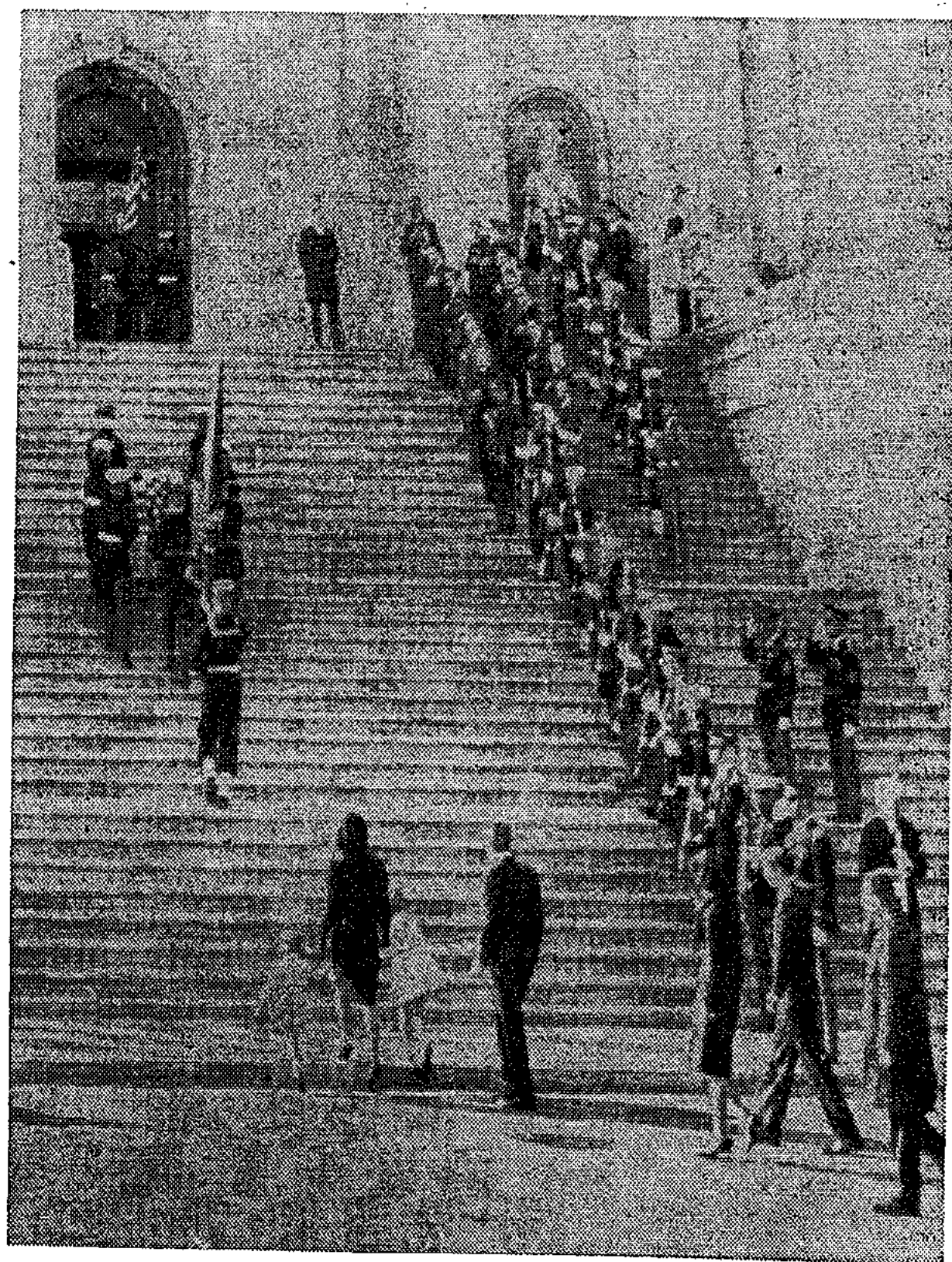

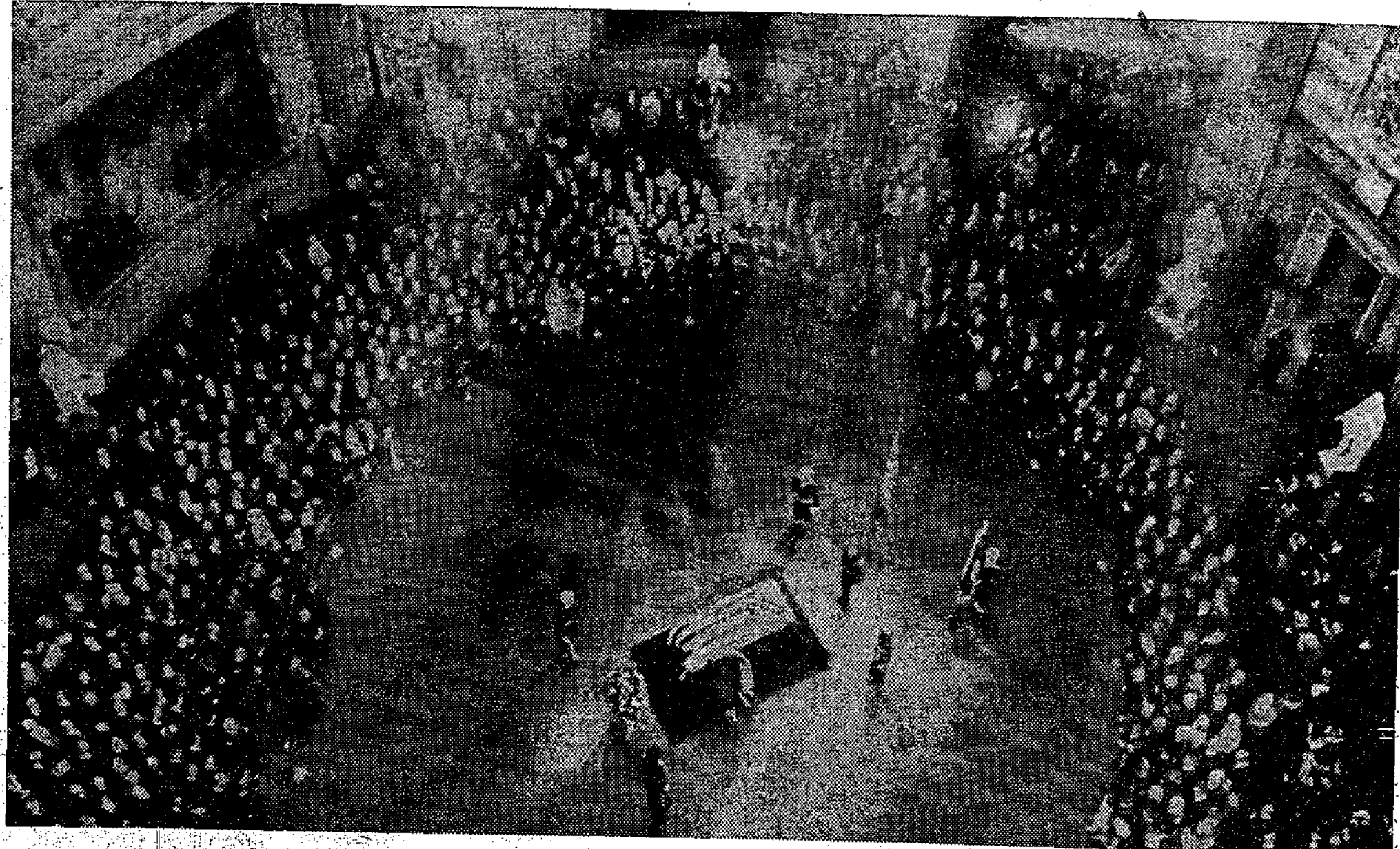
