



French and Indian War


Iroquois League


Albany Plan of Union

The desire to unite the English colonies inspired Benjamin Franklin to create this cartoon, as well as to encourage the Albany Plan of Union.



This drawing that appeared in Benjamin Franklin's *Pennsylvania Gazette* in 1754 is widely considered to be the first political cartoon in the English colonies. Treaty of Paris (1763)



Ambassadors can either live in the country to which they were assigned, or they can be sent for a special negotiation or temporary assignment.






Virginia militia officer whose actions helped to start the French and Indian War.






























